# THE IJ VILLAGE

At **The IJ Village**, our aim is to build a **safe, familial environment** in which our children can find **'A Home Away From Home'** and **'A Family Outside Their Own Families'**.

Support us in our effort to **reach out and impact more young lives** in our community as every child matters.

The new IJ Village will be built on the current premises of the IJ Home at **503 Ang Mo Kio Street 13**. After more than 30 years of use, the IJ Home is currently in a state of disrepair and poses danger to the children housed there.

Alteration and addition work will strengthen the infrastructure, upgrade the residential facilities of the Community Home, Crisis and After-Care Shelter as well as provide improved facilities for our beneficiaries.

From the Gate of Hope at CHIJ (Victoria Street) to the Village of Hope (**The IJ Village**), we aim to enhance the overall well-being of our Beneficiaries through the offer of:

- Community Home for the elderly residents
- Crisis Shelter & After-Care Services
- Literacy & Skills Enhancement
  - Literacy, Numeracy & IT Workshops
  - Sounds of Providence (Music & Dance)
  - Pottery, Painting, Art & Craft & Culinary Workshops
  - Life-skills Workshops, Talks, Camps & Retreats
  - Support of Self-Help Groups
  - Support of the mentally & physically disadvantaged
  - Support of the IJ Sisters' foreign mission



**Infant Jesus Homes & Children's Centres (IJHCC)**, a charitable institution, was formerly known as **Convent Orphanage & Home for Abandoned Babies** when it was located at Victoria Street. Poor and disabled girls were sent by their desperate families to the Sisters of the Infant Jesus and thousands had been cared for since the first abandoned child was received at The Gate of Hope in 1854.

Today, the IJ Sisters remain committed to the service of the poor, especially children. Residential Care, School-based and Community-based Programmes are provided for at-risk children from deprived family backgrounds. In addition, we run a Community Home for the once-abandoned orphans (who are now the elderly residents) and a Crisis Shelter.

Our children are provided protection, shelter and care while they re-build their lives at IJ Centre, Galilee Centre, Oasis at Clementi Primary School, IJ Home & the **upcoming IJ Village (from August 2012)**.

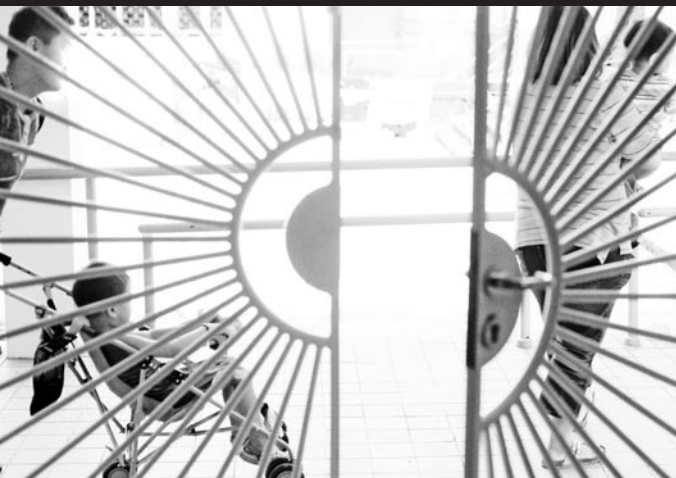

## OUR BENEFICIARIES

The children whom we look after are from all racial groups and religions. Their ages range from 2 to 12 years. Coming from troubled family background, they are faced with challenging issues such as poverty, family violence & substance abuse in the family. Their parents are often absent &/or suffer from ill health mentally or physically.

These children generally exhibit low self confidence and lack respect for self and others. They have poor social and emotional skills as well as poor literacy and numeracy skills.

In addition, we care for some teenagers by guiding them in their academic, social and emotional development. Through our intervention, we aim to provide the much-needed support during this important phase of their lives to help them become



positive, independent and responsible people in the future.

Some of the orphans who were previously living at the Convent Orphanage are still in our care. These senior ladies now reside in the IJ Home.
